BOROUGH STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Summer will be a busy time in the Borough as several projects have been scheduled. The following street projects are slated to be undertaken this summer:

■ The signal upgrade for the Main Street and Manor Street intersection has been approved. It will include all new traffic signal structures and hardware, traffic control software, lighting, sidewalk repair and accessible ramps. JVI Group has been contracted to perform this work which should begin shortly and be completed by the end of the year. Most of the \$473,779.00 expenditure has been offset by an ARLE (Automated Red Light Enforcement) grant from PennDOT.

Seal coating, at a cost of \$103,592.00, will be completed by Martin's Paving on Pennridge Avenue, Georgetown Court, Fairmount Terrace, Rockford Road, Rockford Square, Society Hill Circle and a portion of Spring Hill Lane. This process should extend the life of these streets for 10 years or more.

• Toward the end of summer, milling and paving of portions of Huntington Drive, Spring Hill Lane and Providence Place in Summit Hills will be done by D. H. Funk. The entire \$313,960.00 cost will be funded by the Local Statewide Share Grant, which was recently awarded to the Borough.

• D.H. Funk has been contracted to do milling and paving of North Lemon Street from Hoover Street to the Borough Park during mid to late summer. Work will include resurfacing and a reverse crown on the roadway for proper stormwater runoff. A new dumpster pad and widening of the turn-a-round will also be completed. Funding of \$71,207.00 project was made possible with monies received from the American Rescue Plan Act.

Spring Hill Park Basin Retrofit

After several years of planning and design, the Spring Hill Park Basin Retrofit project is ready for construction and should be completed this summer!

The project will include the following improvements:

- Two small basin areas will be constructed to collect stormwater runoff from two existing pipes. The basins will have flat bottoms so that during small storm events stormwater runoff infiltrates into the ground and is utilized by native plants to fuel growth. Excess sediment has time to settle out before discharging into the wetland area.
- An existing concrete channel conveys spring water flow through the basin via a concrete channel. The channel will be removed and the flow will be diverted to the east side of the basin into a wetland area.
- The basins and constructed wetlands will be seeded with native plant species to filter stormwater pollutants and uptake nutrients.

These improvements will reduce stormwater pollution to a tributary of Strickler Run that flows through Spring Hill Park and will:

- Improve water quality by reducing sediment, nitrogen and phosphorus.
- Reduce stormwater volumes and velocities, which will reduce erosion and sedimentation of downstream areas.
- Increase habitat for native wildlife species including birds, small animals and pollinators.
- Provide visual appeal and aesthetic value to the park.

Mountville Borough selected this project to comply with the current MS4 Stormwater Management Permit which requires the Borough to reduce stormwater pollution to local streams. The project is being funded by a \$200,000 grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) and a \$200,000 grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP).



Mountville Days Carnival

The members of the Mountville Fire Company #1 have announced the scheduling of the 2023 Mountville Days Carnival to be held at Froelich Park, 350 West Main Street, May 17th through May 20th. This annual event is the largest fundraiser for the all-volunteer fire company and it has helped support the operations of the Mountville Fire Company over the years.

This year's carnival will benefit two Mountville organizations. The Mountville Youth Athletic Association will be assisting the firefighters with parking, donation collection and various other tasks in support of the carnival.

Do I Need a Permit?

Permits are required for construction projects within Mountville Borough. Zoning permits are issued to ensure compliance with the Borough Zoning Ordinance and Building permits are issued to ensure compliance with the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code (PA UCC). The Borough contracts with third party building inspectors to provide PA UCC building permit plan reviews and inspections. New Exhibit Coming to the Mountville Museum

Opening this spring is a new exhibit, *"Growing Up in Mountville: Childhood Memories."* The stereoscope, pictured below, from the 1890's will be a featured item in the exhibit. It was considered a sedate form of entertainment on Sundays in the parlor for adults and children alike. The stereoscope was an optical instrument that provided a 3-D image through the viewfinder of photographic slides depicting people, historic sites, travel destinations and religious subjects. The 1897 Sears Roebuck mail-order catalogue advertised a similar one for \$1.87!

The upcoming exhibit will feature photos, artifacts and memorabilia related to growing up in Mountville from the 1800's to the present. Mountville Borough Trash Bills Have Gone Green

Starting with the first quarter 2023 bills, trash bills are now being printed on neon green cardstock. So be on the lookout for the new version of your trash bill in your mail.

Trash bill payments are due on the **15th** of the month following the end of the previous quarter (January, April, July, October). This date applies to weekend and holiday payment days, so plan accordingly when submitting your payment. Mark your calendar with these trash payment due dates for the upcoming quarters:

Second Quarter 2023 – Saturday, April 15th Third Quarter 2023 – Saturday, July 15th Fourth Quarter 2023 – Sunday, October 15th First Quarter 2024 – Monday, January 15th

- In order to avoid paying late fees, payments must be received at the office by 4:00 p.m. on the due date.
- Payments can be dropped off after hours at the Borough office using the drop box located at the back door.
- Please take into account the possibility of delays with payments submitted via the U.S. Postal service.
- Trash bills can be paid online using a credit card or electronic check. Your account can be accessed through the Borough website under the Trash and Recycling tab. A nominal transaction fee is charged by the payment processing company for both credit card and electronic check payments.

YARD WASTE CHANGES

In order to manage trash billing fees, the Mountville Borough Council has determined that Kraft bags for yard waste and leaves will <u>**no longer**</u> be provided by the Borough to residents. Bags are still necessary for disposal

by the Borough to residents. Bags are still necessary for disposal of yard waste and leaves. Biodegradable Kraft bags can be purchased at local home improvement stores or online. Yard waste tags <u>ARE NOT</u> required on bags.

The annual yard waste collection begins on April 7th and continues through September 29th. During this time period, yard waste debris **must** be placed into brown Kraft bags and can be placed curbside on regular trash collection days.
